This dissected material comes from bodies that have kindly been donated by South Australians and forms an essential component in the teaching process. The Museum also houses a variety of anatomical models and charts - some of which have been made here, radiographs and computer based materials.

As part of their continuing education, medical students should be fully familiar with human anatomy. You can imagine it would be impossible to repair a cartilage if the surgeon did not know precisely where it was and what surrounds it, or to transplant a kidney without knowing exactly how its blood vessels are connected.
